The Ryan White Program was created in 1990 to improve the quality and availability of medical care and support services for low-income, uninsured and underinsured individuals and families affected by HIV disease. It is named after Ryan White, an Indiana teenager who courageously struggled with HIV/AIDS while facing discrimination in accessing the education and medical systems.
